# **New Acting DPCPSI Director**

- Nicole C. Kleinstreuer, Ph.D., was appointed Acting NIH Deputy Director for Program Coordination, Planning, and Strategic Initiatives on April 10, 2025.
- Coming from NIEHS Division of Translational Toxicology, as NICEATM Director and ICCVAM Executive Director, she led interagency and international efforts to promote new approach methodologies (NAMs), reduce animal testing, and bring computational modeling, artificial intelligence, and systems toxicology into regulatory science.
- She holds B.S. degrees in biomedical engineering and applied mathematics (UNC-Chapel Hill) and a Ph.D. in bioengineering (University of Canterbury). She completed postdoctoral training in computational toxicology at the U.S. EPA and holds adjunct faculty appointments at Yale University and UNC-Chapel Hill.

Awards received by RADx Tech's Advanced Platforms for HIV Viral Load Monitoring program\*:

- Cepheid, Sunnyvale, California
  Point-of-care technology to quantitatively detect the levels of HIV-1 in under 90 minutes
- Baebies, Inc., Durham, North Carolina
  Optimizing RT-PCR for HIV assay sensitivity, blood processing techniques, and viral load quantification capabilities
- **Prompt Diagnostics, Baltimore**Magnetofluidic cartridge platform that facilitates automated infectious disease testing in the clinic that makes results available in less than 30 minutes

#### Disability Health Research Strategic Plan

**DPCPSI** is leading development of the agency-wide NIH Strategic Plan for Disability Health Research FY26-FY30

- Leads a cross-agency research coordinating committee, bringing together subject matter experts from 24 ICs and 18 Offices and Programs to share research advances and collaborate
- Hosted six Community Roundtable Discussions and a public Town Hall, to gain insights
  from people with disabilities, researchers, clinicians, professional associations, and advocacy orgs
- **Published a Request for Information (RFI)** to obtain public feedback on the draft framework for the strategic plan, analysis of 140+ responses is underway

- Release the NIH Strategic Plan for Disability Health Research FY26-FY30 later this year
