# HIV/AIDS Scholars Using Nonhuman Primate (NHP) Models Program (K01)

**Objective:** To provide salary, mentorship, and research support to early stage investigators in the field of HIV/AIDS translational studies and enable them to translate promising preclinical research from NHPs to human clinical trials.

**Funds Available and Anticipated Number of Awards:** Contingent upon NIH appropriations and the submission of meritorious applications

Award Project Period: 3 years

### **Background**

#### **HIV/AIDS Scholars Using NHP Models Program (K01)**

- First issued in 2016 as PAR-16-347 initial focus on translational HIV/AIDS vaccine research using NHP models
- NOT-OD-17-116: Broadened PAR to include all preclinical high priority AIDS research involving NHP models
- Reissued as PAR-19-267 (expired October 2019)
- Developed and supported jointly with the Office of AIDS Research

### Inspired by successful NIAID model of mentored training in AIDS vaccine research

- Adamson et al. A New Model for Catalyzing Translational Science: The Early Stage Investigator Mentored Research Scholar Program in HIV Vaccines. Clin Trans Sci 8:166-168 (2012)
- Inadequate supply of researchers trained in the preclinical use of NHPs for HIV/AIDS vaccines
- Targets early stage investigators
- Salary support + adequate funds to support research



### **Purpose**

- 3-year award
- Two required mentors
  - Expert in NHP models
  - Expert in clinical translational research
- Salary + Research Support
  - Up to \$75,000 salary and \$100,000 research support per year
- Eligibility
  - Doctoral degree
  - >3 years postdoctoral training or equivalent
  - Within 10 years of terminal degree
  - Affiliation with NHP facility and skilled staff



## **Progress and Impacts**

- Young program initiated in 2016 (3 years of activity)
  - First cohort completed program in late 2019
  - FY16 to FY18: 21 applications from 19 applicants, 9 awards
- Among first 9 awardees
  - 5 awardees competed successfully for independent funding
    - Collectively 3 R21 (NIAID), 2 R01 (NIAID), 1 RF1 (NIA) and 1 R03 (NIAID)
  - 3 awardees have pending grant applications under review
    - 1 R21 (NIAID)
    - 2 R01 (NIAID, NICHD)
  - 27 peer-reviewed publications between FY16 and FY18 (e.g., PNAS, PLOS ONE), 12 as first or last author
  - Permanent research positions: all of first cohort, one of second cohort
