Administrative Supplements for Research on Dietary Supplements

Objective: to provide supplemental funds to relevant, active, NIH-supported research projects to incorporate dietary supplement research that is within the scope of the parent award

Funds Available and Anticipated Number of Awards: Contingent upon NIH appropriations and the submission of meritorious applications

Award Project Period: up to 1 year

Council Action: Vote for continued support for "Administrative Supplements for Research on Dietary Supplements"



Background

Supporting research to evaluate the health effects of dietary supplements and the underlying biological mechanisms by which they affect health is a congressional mandate and a key component of ODS's Strategic Plan

- ODS does not have direct grant funding authority
- ODS can either co-fund grants or fund administrative supplements to active NIH grants







- Designed to support research in which the primary emphasis is on dietary supplements and/or their ingredients in health maintenance and disease prevention
 - Research must be within scope of the parent grant
 - Not limited to specific health conditions, organ systems or population groups
 - ➤ All types of research, including preclinical, clinical, behavioral and epidemiological
 - > Supplements must be administered orally in physiologically relevant forms and concentrations
 - Need to provide product integrity information
- Budget limited to \$100,000 direct costs for up to 1 year
- Must have 18 months remaining on the parent grant at the time of submission
