


Life expectancy vs. Health Expenditure From 1970-2018





ARPA-H Authorities

- Hiring outside civil service
- Program Managers for 3-6 yr terms
- Broad, flexible funding
- Exemptions from traditional review





Pasteur's Quadrant?









Responsible for programs from proposal to transition

Every decision at ARPA-H is informed by the "Heilmeier Questions"

ARPA-H/Qs: The Heilmeier Questions

- 1 What problem are we trying to solve?
- 2 How does this get done at present? Who does it? What are the limitations of present approaches?
- What is new about our approach? Why do we think we can be successful at this time?
- 4 Who cares? If we succeed, what difference will it make? How can we help ensure outcomes are equitable?*
- 5 What are the risks?
- 6 How long will it take?
- 7 How much will it cost?
- 8 What are our mid-term and final exams to check for success?

Intelligible Failure


 Good Problems: Clearly important, clearly hard, and clearly measurable. "The only real failure is the one we learn nothing from."

 Trust but Verify: "It's not what you don't know that will hurt you. It's what you know for certain that just ain't so."




