

What is the difference between application ID, core- and full- grant numbers?

The core project number is the overarching number a grant has through all of the renewal processes. Each unit of a grant gets a unique Application ID. For example, each year of a grant’s renewal (competing or non-competing) the grant gets a new Application ID, but the core grant number remains the same. Subprojects also get their own Application ID as do change in status within a year. Here is an example:
